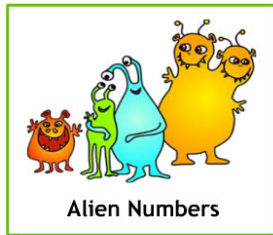
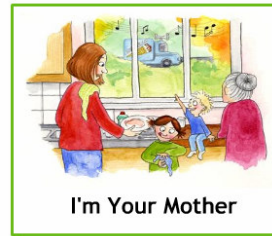
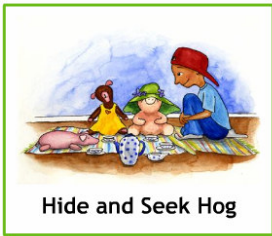
Grade 00 – Grade 3 or useful for Additional Language speakers to grade 7
